Celebrating Learning and Achievements

2017 Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE) Results

Our heartiest congratulations to our P6 cohort of 2017, parents and staff for our school's commendable PSLE results. Besides demonstrating academic excellence, our students also demonstrated all-round excellence with exemplary conduct, resilience and attitude towards learning.

- 99.4% of all students passed PSLE.
- The percentage passes for all Standard subjects are above the national average.
- The distinction (A/A*) passes for Standard English, Mathematics, Science, Chinese and Malay are above the national average.
- 85.1% of students who took 4 Standard Subjects were eligible to opt for the Express course at the Secondary level.
- 90.9% of students who took 4 Standard Subjects were eligible to opt for the Express course or Express course with Normal Academic at the Secondary level.
- 9.1% of our students were offered places via Direct School Admission (DSA) at secondary schools such as Anglican High School, Meridien Secondary School, Methodist Girls' School, Nanyang Girls' High School, National Junior College, Raffles Girls' School, School of the Arts, Singapore Chinese Girls' School and Tanjong Katong Girls' School.

School and Student Achievements

We are also pleased to share with you the school's environment awards and the achievements of our students in the Character & Citizenship Education, Language Arts, Performing and visual arts, Mathematics & Science, Information and Communication Technology, Sports and Uniformed Groups. We are proud of our students who have given their best and demonstrated our school values, including students who have taken part in various competitions and have not won awards. We would also like to express our heartfelt appreciation to our teachers and instructors for their dedication and hard work, and to all parents for their support and involvement. Our staff conducted professional sharing and lesson demonstrations of our school's good practices and innovative programmes at cluster, zonal, national and international platforms. Details are in Annex B. We received positive feedback about the quality of the professional sharing and lesson demonstrations conducted. We are proud of our teachers' commitment to professional development and their contributions to the education fraternity.

Character and Citizenship Education (CCE)

Values and Leadership Qualities

At Haig Girls' School, we place an emphasis on character education and leadership development. This year, we will be deepening the explicit teaching and learning of the school values by focusing on a school value each term – Term 1: Commitment, Term 2: Integrity, Term 3: Concern and Term 4: Cooperation.

Our teachers have gone through our I4C school values, leadership qualities and the meaning behind our students' creed with our students on the first day of school. These are also spelt out in the 2018 Student Handbook and we seek your assistance to reinforce the key points with your child/ward when teachable moments arise.

National Education Core Event – Total Defence Day

We will be commemorating this day through an assembly program for all the students and learning journey to the Singapore Discovery Centre for our P3 to P6 students in February. The theme this year is 'Together We Keep Singapore Strong' and our students will be learning more about Singapore's five pillars of Total Defence and how everyone can and should play a part in defending Singapore.

Responsible Use of Social Media

We expect all students to use social media responsibly. Students are expected to adhere to netiquette and respect other users. We would like to seek all parents' cooperation to collaborate with the school in ensuring that students' interaction and participation on social platforms are supervised.

Registration policy of social media platforms (such as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram) specifies that these platforms are meant for those aged 13 and above. Hence, the school **will not** be using these social media platforms to interact with students. We have adopted more age-appropriate platforms such as Google sites and our Learning Management System for communication and educational purposes.

All students under 13 are **not** allowed to set up their own Facebook, Twitter or Instagram accounts. If your family has set up a Facebook, Twitter and/or Instagram account, we seek your assistance to supervise your daughter's use of these social media platforms. For our alumni, we will continue to inform them about alumni outreach events via the HGS Alumni Association Facebook page.

Use of Handphones

This is a reminder about our school rule regarding the use of handphones – as stated in our Student Handbook, students must switch off their mobile phones during **all** school activities. They can only use their mobile phones in the canteen and near school gates before and after school hours. Handphones will be confiscated from students who break these rules and we will contact parents/guardians to retrieve their handphones from the school's general office. We seek all parents' cooperation in reinforcing the responsible use of handphones among our students.

Health and Safety Related Matters

Personal and Social Responsibility

Safeguarding the health and well-being of our students is our collective responsibility.

- All students are reminded to maintain good hygiene practices such as frequent hand washing, before handling food or eating, after going to the toilet, or after they have coughed or sneezed.
- The school will do our part to ensure sufficient washing facilities with soap and we would also like to seek the cooperation of all parents and guardians to reinforce good hygiene habits at home.
- If your child is unwell, she should not be in school and should see a doctor. Please ensure that your child has fully recovered with official clearance from the doctor before returning to school.

As part of nation-wide measures to maintain schools' preparedness in health matters, there will be a temperature-taking exercise on **Friday, 5 January 2018**. We would like to seek your assistance to ensure that your child brings her working thermometer to school on **Wednesday, 3 January 2018**.

Healthy Snack Days

School hours end at 1.40pm from Mondays to Thursdays. Hence, there will be a healthy snack break at 12.05pm on these four days. Kindly ensure that your child/ward brings a fruit or healthy snacks on these days. Healthy snack options include sandwiches, low fat yoghurt, fresh fruit, dried fruit or nuts. These items are healthier compared to popular snacks such as cookies, crisps, chips and candies. Please purchase snacks for your child/ward with the Healthier Snack Symbol (HSS) introduced by the Health Promotion Board (HPB).

We are encouraging our pupils to practise healthy eating habits in their daily lives. We encourage all parents to ensure that this is reinforced at home so that your child is able to develop healthy eating habits at an early age.

Road Safety

To ensure the safety of our students and other road users, minimise inconvenience to nearby residents, and to maintain free access to emergency vehicles, we would appreciate your strong support in observing the following measures:

1.	Parking in School	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Due to the limited number of parking lots, car parking in the school compound is strictly for staff only.• Please use the public car parks in the vicinity when visiting the school.
2.	Dropping off or picking up your child/ward	Parents/Guardians are only allowed to drive into the school to <ul style="list-style-type: none">• drop off their child/ward in the mornings from 6.45am to 7.25am• pick up their child/ward 15 minutes after school dismissal time, when the school buses have left the school compound (estimated 2.00pm from Mondays to Thursdays and 1.00pm on Fridays)
3.	Driving within the school compound before 7.30am and after school dismissal	Please adhere to the following school safety guidelines: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Drive in through Gate 1, drop your child/ward off at the designated drop off point, and drive out through Gate 5. Vehicles will have to turn left towards Still Road in the mornings from 7.00am to 7.30am.• Ensure that your child/ward alights briskly from the vehicle so that traffic is not held up during arrival and dismissal time.• Adhere to a speed limit of 15km/h within the school compound.• You may also drop your child/ward off at Gate 3 along Tembeling Rd or Gate 4 along Everitt Rd.

Access to the School

Safety is of utmost importance to all at HGS. We strive to ensure that we provide a safe and secure environment for all students and staff. Hence, all visitors (including parents and guardians) are required to sign in/out with the security guards at Gates 1 or 2 where they will receive a visitor's pass. After receiving the pass, visitors will need to report to the General Office so that the office staff can attend to your needs. Please do not go directly to the classroom or staff room to see teachers or students.

Students Going Home on Their Own

For the safety of our students, when students are not taking the school bus home or are not attending CCA / remedial / D3T2 / enrichment lessons, we would appreciate that parents/guardians inform the bus driver and/or teacher in charge directly. Please assist to remind your child/ward that she should go home immediately after school and not visit their friends without your prior permission. If your child/ward does not take the school bus, please ensure that she, especially if she is in P1-2, goes home with an authorised adult.

Lunch for Students after Dismissal

Parents and caregivers who would like to pass their child/ward her lunch are allowed to enter the school from Gate 2 either 15 minutes before school dismissal or 10 minutes after school dismissal. Please arrange for your child/ward to meet you at the linkway between Gate 2 and the foyer. We would however like to remind parents/guardians that, given the space constraints in the canteen, we seek your kind understanding not to stay in the canteen after you have passed your child/ward her lunch. This will encourage our students to be independent as they learn to eat and finish their lunch on their own.

POSB Smart Buddy Programme

We have been working with POSB to implement the POSB Smart Buddy Programme in the school. With the POSB Smart Buddy, students can use the watch to pay for purchases at the school bookshop, canteen and selected merchants outside of school. The watch also allows parents and students to track their spending habits, savings and fitness levels. Curriculum Briefings & In-Conversation with School Leaders

As part of our school's efforts to better engage parents and strengthen school-family partnership, curriculum briefings and In-Conversation with School Leaders will be streamlined to four levels – P1, 4, 5 and 6.

Curriculum Briefing for parents of P1 students will be conducted during the first week of the new school year.

The P6 Curriculum Briefing & In-Conversation with School Leaders will be conducted on Sat, 3 Feb 2018. All P6 students and their parents are encouraged to attend the session. Details of the session will be made known nearer to the date.

Both P4 and 5 Curriculum Briefing sessions will be held in Term 2. Details of the sessions will be made known nearer to the dates.

School-Parent Partnership

Our school believes that parents are our partners and a meaningful collaboration with our parents supports our students' holistic development. We would like to partner you to develop your child to be the best that she can be. Your child will benefit the most when we put her at the heart of what we do, understand our shared responsibilities and work together to bring out the best in her. Having a close partnership with us will help you to better understand your child's learning experience in school, so that you can provide her with the necessary family care, support and reinforcement at home.

You can support your child in various ways. We encourage you to join our HGS Parents Support Group (PSG) so that you can get involved in the school's activities and get to know other parents in school. You can sign up for activities that suit your schedule and how you wish to contribute to the school.

Punctuality - All students should be punctual for school and should be in school before 7.30am, which is when the flag-raising ceremony begins. This is in line with our school value of

'Commitment', and the responsible behaviour that is involved when our students live out this value. We would appreciate it if parents make the effort to take their children to school on time. We have a range of interesting pre-assembly morning programmes, which will begin the week of 15 Jan 2018 (details in the table below). We encourage the girls to be in school by 7.20am so that they can benefit from these programmes.

The school gates will be closed at 7.30am. If a student arrives after 7.30am, she will need to enter the school via side gate 2. The names of students who are late will be recorded – a letter will be sent to the parents of students who are late more than 5 times in a term and disciplinary action may be taken against these students.

Students identified for remedial and stretch lessons will be informed through their subject teachers.

The school has reviewed the duration of remedial and stretch lessons for 2018. Each lesson will be 45-minute instead of 60-minute long. This change aims to facilitate the students' learning in their lessons.

Care for Personal Belongings - Students are responsible for their own personal belongings and should avoid bringing valuables or excessive amounts of money to school. As leaders of character, students must be committed to take care of their belongings. Students are strongly encouraged to label their belongings and school uniform clearly with their names and classes so as to allow easy identification of their personal belongings. They should also take responsibility to pack their school bags daily and ensure that they have the necessary materials needed for school the next day.

Support - To support your child in doing her best, please provide a quiet home environment for your child to focus on her studies. Do praise your child's good efforts and progress, and not only her successes. Do not dwell on mistakes and academic marks. Rather, encourage her to strive for improvement. Give your child the confidence to seek help from her teachers.

We seek your kind understanding if teachers are not able to return your calls immediately as they are conducting lessons or after-school activities. Unless it is an emergency, we do not expect our teachers to respond to parents' emails or text messages which are sent on weekends and public holidays and between 6.00 pm and 7.00 am. Homework Policy

At Haig Girls' School, we believe that age-appropriate, manageable and meaningful homework is beneficial and supports our students' learning.

Objectives of homework:

Homework

- reinforces lessons taught in class and allows students to consolidate their learning, gain additional practice and apply concepts learnt;
- involving reading/research before lessons helps to nurture independent and self-directed learners;
- allows teachers to monitor students' understanding and progress so that they can provide timely intervention and feedback;
- provides parents/guardians with information on their child/ward's progress and opportunities to be involved in her learning.

The completion of homework also allows our students to take responsibility for their learning and cultivate important study habits and life skills such as time management and self-direction.

To ensure that homework is manageable for our students, our school has developed the following homework time norms per day:

Level	P1	P2	P3	P4	P5	P6
No. of hours per day on average (from Mon - Fri)	½ - 1 (i.e.: 2½ - 5h weekly)	1 - 1½	1½ - 2	1½ - 2	2 - 2½	2 - 3

To give our students time for other pursuits over the weekend, we have not included weekends in the time norms. The completion of homework assigned on Fridays can be spread over the weekend.

We seek parents/guardians' understanding if homework time norms are exceeded during the pre-exam period (especially for P6 classes), when practice papers are given.

Homework Board – To coordinate the daily homework load across subjects, every classroom has a homework board which will indicate the homework amount, the approximate time needed and the deadline for each subject. Students will record all assigned homework in the Student Handbook.

Homework File – Students will place all their homework (e.g. worksheets, exercise books, workbooks, practice papers) for each day in a homework file. Form teachers will provide students with more information pertaining to this homework file. Parents/Guardians need not purchase a new file and are welcome to reuse any existing file that fulfils the criteria of the homework file.

As part of our school's efforts to nurture self-directed learners and imbue our students with the school value of 'Commitment', we will remind our students to be self-disciplined and responsible in completing their homework independently and punctually. However, we do recognize that our students also need support and encouragement from their parents/guardians.

As our partners-in-education, we seek your support in the following matters:

- check your child/ward's homework file and acknowledge in the Student Handbook that you have taken note of the homework assigned;
- ensure that your child/ward has a quiet, conducive environment to complete her homework; encourage your child/ward to exercise self-discipline and complete her homework within the stipulated timeframe;
- school homework takes precedence over other work assigned by yourself or your child/ward's tutor, if she has one;
- if your child/ward has difficulty with her homework, do not give her the answers but guide her with questions and indicate on the homework 'assisted' so that the teacher knows the areas that your child/ward had difficulty with and can take steps to address it.

If your child/ward has a more intensive performing arts rehearsal or sports practice/competition schedule during a particular period of time, please inform the respective subject teachers. While our teachers will be flexible about homework deadlines for these exceptional cases, we encourage our students to manage their time well and seek the co-operation of parents/guardians to ensure that your child/ward balances her other commitments with her academic responsibilities.
