To assess the different learning outcomes, the school has developed a range of age-appropriate assessment modes to enable our students to demonstrate their learning such as performance tasks, practical tests, project work and varied oral presentations, in addition to written assessments.

We believe that with our balanced approach to assessment, our Haig girls will find greater joy in learning and continue to develop the intrinsic motivation to learn.

Important Points to take note:

- Students who are ill should not be in school for tests and examinations. Our Haig girl should seek medical attention as the school cares for her wellbeing and she will not be in the position to give her best effort to the assessment.
- If a student misses a test because of an illness, she needs to submit a medical certificate upon her return. The student, in this case, will not get a '0' for the test. The school will indicate 'VR' (Valid Reason) in her report book and her overall marks will be pro-rated accordingly.
- Students who do not have a valid reason for missing their assessment may get an 'AB (Absent)' which will translate to zero mark for that assessment. Please check with the school if your child will be missing an assessment for reason/s other than being ill.
